Readings

First Reading Isaiah 25: 6-9

Celebration and thanksgiving for God's deliverance. The celebration comes in the form of a good feast with the best food and finest wine. It is also centred in the gift of the love of God, focusing on the immensity of his care and protection to bring the people out of the darkness of death and destruction to a new life.

Second Reading Acts 10: 34-43

Peter speaks to those gathered at the house of Cornelius, a centurion, with a summary of his teaching about Jesus. Peter tells them how he witnessed the death and resurrection of Jesus and was commissioned to preach and teach the good news and to testify that Jesus is the one appointed by God and spoken of by the prophets. Peter emphasizes his witness to a real relationship with Jesus and, through him, with God. It is through this realization and our personal development of a relationship that we receive forgiveness of sins and a new life in Christ. 16: Mark 1-8

Mark's account of the resurrection centres on the experience of the women at the tomb. They arrive to anoint the body to find the stone rolled away. Inside the tomb they find a man in a white robe who tells them Jesus is risen and they will see him in Galilee. The women are afraid and confused and flee from the tomb, unable and unwilling to speak about their experiences.

2nd Sunday of Easter 8th April

Exodus 14: 10-31, 15: 20-21

Moses leads the Israelites between the parted waves of the Red Sea, the Egyptians try to follow but are all drowned.

Acts 4: 32-35

This a generalized summary of the life in the early Christian community, which was characterized by unity, witness and the renunciation of wealth and possessions.

John 20: 19-31

After Jesus appeared to Mary Magdalene, he then appears to the disciples later in the day. He passes on the Holy Spirit and confers the power to forgive sins. Thomas is not present and cannot believe what the others tell him.
